This professional development course is designed to address the principles and skills needed to administer medications to children. The course is specifically designed for personnel working in Iowa childcare businesses. The course addresses the administration of oral medications, eye drops and ointments, ear drops, nasal drops and sprays, rectal medications, topical creams and ointments, nebulizer treatments and metered-dose inhalers.

The instruction for this course consists of two segments. First, there is classroom instruction which includes lecture, PowerPoint presentations, large and small group activities and relevant reading materials provided by the instructor. The duration of this segment is estimated to take 5 hours for a class of approximately 15 attendees.

After completing the 5 hour course, the second segment of the course begins. During the second segment, the participant will practice then give an individual demonstration of their competency and skills in accurate and safe medication administration using simulated medications. The participant will be evaluated using the Competency Skill Assessment Checklist. Individuals are scheduled for this segment of the course. The Competency Skill Assessment is estimated to require ninety minutes per attendee. If the individual does not successfully complete the Competency skill Assessment after three attempts, the attendee is required to repeat the 5 hour classroom segment of the course. Medication administration is a serious responsibility and accuracy is the prime focus. Attendees are expected to have a minimum of a passing score of 80% to successfully complete the Competency Skill Assessment. Individuals responsible for administering medication shall successfully complete the Competency Skill Assessment on an annual basis.

This class does not allow participants to teach the materials at their place of employment. This course can only be taught by a Registered Nurse at your local community college.
