





- ✓ Your classes will be taught by high school instructors who are qualified to teach college courses.
- ✓ All the same support resources are available to you.



What to Expect From Your Classes at IWCC

- ✓ Your instructor will meet as scheduled and hold you to deadlines.
- ✓ You will be treated like a college student.

- ✓ Communicate with instructor through designated format.


