COVER THE COST OF TRAINING FOR YOUR NEW OR GROWING WORKFORCE

260E provides training funds to Iowa businesses to train their new or expanding workforce. The purpose of the program is to assist businesses either locating or expanding within the state of Iowa to stretch their training dollars to strengthen the skills and productivity of their team.

WHAT TYPES OF BUSINESSES ARE ELIGIBLE?

Businesses in Iowa that are engaged in manufacturing, processing, warehousing, distributing, and wholesaling

WHAT TRAINING COSTS CAN BE REIMBURSED?

Eligible training can include:

- Customized training provided by IWCC
- IWCC Credit Courses
- Contracted training
- Training costs may be reimbursed at 100% of training costs

**Wages of the employees during instructional as well as on-the-job training may be reimbursed.*

Types of training can include:

- Industrial Maintenance
- Computer Skills
- Health and Safety
- Management and Supervision
- Language and Communication
- MUCH MORE!

HOW DOES IT WORK?

- No cost to the business to participate
- Business must be new to or expanding within the state of Iowa
- Training dollars derive from certificates sold by Iowa Western Community College
- Certificates are paid for by the partial diversion of the new employees' payroll withholding tax.
