## IOWA WESTERN COMMUNITY COLLEGE SEVERE WEATHER PLAN-STANDARD RESPONSE PROTOCOL (SHELTER)

Every year in the United States, hundreds of people are killed and thousands injured because of the weather. Dangerous weather can take many forms, ranging from violent tornadoes to crippling winter storms. With the notable exception of hurricanes, Iowa can experience any of these dangerous phenomena.

While there is nothing, we can do to stop dangerous weather from affecting us, there are proactive decisions that can be made to remain safe when the weather turns nasty. Weather safety and survival, no matter what the hazard, depends on the following key items:

**1. KNOW THE HAZARDS -** Be aware of the hazards that you might face during a weather event. Current weather hazards that could impact the campus can be found at the Pottawattamie County Hazard Mitigation Plan web page <u>HERE</u>.

**2. KNOW WHEN TO EXPECT DANGEROUS WEATHER -** Monitor forecasts and information from your local news stations. All members of the IWCC community can sign up for free severe weather alerts provided through the Alert Iowa system <u>HERE</u>.

(*Note:* Be sure to use the IWCC primary address when signing up for alerts. Once you are no longer living or working on campus you can log in to the account you created and cancel your selected alerts. The service is free of charge.)

3. PAY ATTENTION - Be aware of all watches, warnings, and advisories affecting you.

**4. HAVE A PLAN TO STAY SAFE -** Think about it before it happens and be ready to act to survive.
